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PART 1

GENERAL REGULATIONS

§101. DEFINITIONS AND INTERPRETATION.

1. Words and phrases, when used in this Chapter, except for sections or parts to which different or additional definitions apply, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in The Vehicle Code, the Act of June 17, 1976, P.L. 162 No. 81, as amended, except that, in this Chapter the word "street" may be used interchangeably with the word "highway", and shall have the same meaning as the word "highway" as defined in the Vehicle Code.
2. The term "legal holidays" as used in this Chapter shall mean and include: New Year's Day, Martin Luther King's Birthday, Presidents Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Columbus Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, and Christmas Day.
3. In this Chapter, the singular shall include the plural, the plural shall include the singular, and the masculine shall include the feminine.
4. Although the streets in the Borough of Bedford run generally in a northeast-southwest and a northwest-southeast direction, for the purposes of this Chapter, Juliana Street and the streets running parallel or generally parallel to Juliana Street shall be deemed to run in a north-south direction, and Pitt Street and the streets parallel or generally parallel to Pitt Street shall be deemed to run in an east-west direction.

§102. MANNER OF ADOPTING PERMANENT TRAFFIC AND PARKING REGULATIONS.

All traffic and parking regulations of a permanent nature shall be enacted as ordinances, as parts of ordinances, as amendments to ordinances, or as amendments to this Chapter, except where the law specifically authorizes less formal action.

§103. PROVISIONS TO BE CONTINUATION OF EXISTING REGULATIONS.

The provisions of this Chapter, so far as they are the same as those of ordinances and regulations in force immediately before the enactment of this Chapter, are intended as a continuation of those earlier ordinances and regulations, and not as new enactments. Nothing in this Chapter shall affect any act done or liability incurred, or any suit or prosecution pending or to be instituted under any of those repealed or superseded ordinances or regulations.

MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC

§104. TEMPORARY AND EMERGENCY REGULATIONS.

1. The authorized representative of the Borough of Bedford shall have the following powers to regulate traffic and parking temporarily and in time of emergency:
 - A. In the case of fire, flood, storm or other emergency, to establish temporary traffic and/or parking regulations; and,
 - B. In the case of emergency or to facilitate public works, or in the conduct of parades, processions or public events, to restrict or prohibit traffic and/or parking in limited areas for periods of not more than seventy-two (72) hours.
2. Such temporary and emergency regulations shall be enforced by the Police Department in the same manner as permanent regulations. Any person who shall operate or park a vehicle or tractor in violation of any such regulations, or who shall move, remove, destroy, injure or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made to give notice of any such regulation, shall upon conviction thereof, be subject to the penalty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter for a violation of such nature, and, in case of a violation for which no specific penalty is set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter, to a fine of not more than \$25 together with costs of prosecution.

§105. EXPERIMENTAL REGULATIONS.

The Borough Council may, from time to time by resolution, designate places upon and along the highways in the Borough where, for a period of not more than 90 days, specific traffic and/or parking regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be in force and effect, and shall designate such locations by proper signs and markings. Such regulations, prohibitions and restrictions shall be effective as if they had been specified in this Chapter. No person shall operate and no person shall move, remove, destroy or deface any sign or marking erected, posted or made by authority of this Section. Any person who shall violate any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to the penalty set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter for a violation of such nature, and in case of a violation for which no specific penalty is set forth in the law or elsewhere in this Chapter, to a fine of not more than \$25 together with costs of prosecution; provided, the purpose of this Section is to allow for the test and experimental determination of the feasibility and desirability of permanent changes in the ordinances of the Borough of Bedford relative to traffic and parking.

§106. TRAFFIC ON STREETS CLOSED OR RESTRICTED FOR CONSTRUCTION, MAINTENANCE OR SPECIAL EVENTS.

1. The Borough Council shall have authority to close any street or specific part of a street to vehicular traffic and to place barriers or station police officers at each end of the closed portion, while construction or maintenance work is under way or a special event is being conducted on the closed portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such closed portion.

2. The Borough Council shall have authority to establish a restricted traffic area upon any street where construction or maintenance work is under way and to station flag-men at each end of the restricted portion. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle upon any such restricted traffic area at any time when the flagman is displaying a sign directing that vehicle to stop, or is signaling that vehicle, by a flag or other device, not to proceed.
3. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 and costs.

§107. USE OF STREETS BY PROCESSIONS AND ASSEMBLAGES.

1. For the purpose of this Section, the words "assemblage" and "procession" shall have the following meanings:

ASSEMBLAGE - a gathering of people without vehicles, which interferes with the movement of pedestrian or vehicular traffic on any street.

PROCESSION - a group of individuals, vehicles, animals and/or objects moving along a street in a way that interferes with the normal movement of traffic. A procession shall not include a funeral caravan or military convoy.

2. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or participate in any assemblage unless the person organizing or conducting the assemblage first obtains permission from the Parade Committee and the Council of the Borough of Bedford. Application for permission shall be made at least 30 days in advance of the day on which the assemblage is proposed to be held. The application shall state the place where and when the assemblage is to be formed, the route of the assemblage, the place and when the assemblage is to be dispersed and any other information deemed to be pertinent. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or participate in any assemblage unless permission has been granted, or at any time other than that authorized by the Parade Committee or the Council of the Borough of Bedford.
3. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or participate in any procession unless the person organizing or conducting the procession first obtains from the Parade Committee and the Council of the Borough of Bedford. Application for permission shall be made at least 30 days in advance of the day which the procession is proposed to be held. The application shall state the place where and when the procession is to be formed, the route of the procession, the place and when the procession is to be dispersed and any other information deemed to be pertinent. It shall be unlawful for any person to hold or to participate in any procession unless permission has been granted, or at any time or place other than that authorized by the Parade Committee or the Council of the Borough of Bedford.
4. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 and costs.

MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC

§108. AUTHORITY OF POLICE OFFICERS.

The police officers of the Borough of Bedford are hereby authorized to direct traffic on the highways of the Borough and at intersections thereof and to otherwise enforce the provisions of this Chapter.

§109. AUTHORIZATION FOR USE OF SPEED TIMING DEVICES.

1. The Borough Police Department is hereby authorized to use all speed timing devices for the determination of speed of a motor vehicle as are approved or will be approved by the Department of Transportation of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, in accordance with Title 75, Pa. C.S.A. §3368.
2. This Section authorizes the use of said devices upon all highways within the Borough be they Borough, county or State highways, and does also hereby elect to exercise all powers granted to "local authorities" under the Vehicle Code of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, 75 Pa. C.S.A. §6101 et seq., (1977), as hereafter amended, supplemented, modified or reenacted by the General Assembly of Pennsylvania.

PART 2
TRAFFIC REGULATIONS

§201. MAXIMUM SPEED LIMITS ESTABLISHED ON CERTAIN STREETS.

1. Maximum speed limits are established on portions of specified streets, as follows, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle, on any part of a street where a maximum speed limit applies, at a higher speed than the maximum prescribed for that part of the street:

2. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$35. Any person exceeding the maximum speed limit by more than five miles per hour shall pay an additional fine of \$2 per mile for each mile in excess of five miles per hour over the maximum speed limit.

§202. MAXIMUM SPEED LIMITS ESTABLISHED IN PARKS.

1. A speed of 15 miles per hour is established on all streets and roadways in the public parks maintained and operated by the Borough as follows:

2. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$35. Any person exceeding the maximum speed limit by more than five miles per hour shall pay an additional fine of \$2 per mile for each mile in excess of five miles per hour over the maximum speed limit.

§203. TRAFFIC SIGNALS AT CERTAIN LOCATIONS.

1. At the following locations, traffic signals as indicated below shall be erected (or are ratified if previously erected), and traffic at those locations shall be directed by those signals:

2. Any driver of a vehicle who disobeys the directions of any traffic signal shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 and costs.

§204. ONE-WAY STREETS ESTABLISHED.

1. The following are established as one-way streets, and it shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle on any one-way street other than in the direction established for traffic on that street:

§205. TURNING AT CERTAIN INTERSECTIONS PROHIBITED OR RESTRICTED.

1. It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle, of the type indicated, traveling upon the first-named street at any of the following intersections, in the direction or directions indicated in each case, to make a left turn and/or a right turn into the second-named street, as indicated, at any time when such a turn is prohibited by this Section:

§206. THROUGH HIGHWAYS ESTABLISHED.

1. The following highways are established as through highways, thus authorizing stop or yield signs to be erected facing traffic approaching every intersection with the through highway except for those intersections with traffic signals, or with exceptions or modifications as indicated below. Every driver of a vehicle approaching a stop or yield sign authorized by this section shall stop the vehicle or yield right-of-way as required by §§3323(b) or 3323(c) of the Vehicle Code, as the case may be, and shall not proceed into or across the through highway until he has followed all applicable requirements of that Section of the law:

§207. STOP INTERSECTIONS ESTABLISHED.

1. The following intersections (in addition to intersections with the through highways established by §206) are established as stop intersections, and official stop signs shall be erected (or are ratified if previously erected) in such a position as to face traffic approaching the second-named street (the intersecting or through street) on the first-named street (the stop street) in the direction or directions indicated for that intersection. Every driver of a vehicle approaching the intersection on the first named or stop street, in the direction indicated in each case, shall stop the vehicle as required by §3323(b) of the Vehicle Code, and shall not proceed into or across the second-named or intersecting or through street until he has followed all applicable requirements of that Section of the law.

§208. OPERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES RESTRICTED ON PUBLIC LANDS.

1. No motor vehicle including a motorcycle, pedalcycle or minibike shall be operated on any property owned by the Borough or any other public agency or instrumentality within the Borough without the permission of the property owner and a permit from the Chief of Police of the Borough of Bedford.
2. Any person who violates a provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 and costs.

PART 3

RESTRICTIONS ON SIZE, WEIGHT AND TYPE OF VEHICLE AND LOAD

§301. TRUCK TRAFFIC RESTRICTED ON CERTAIN STREETS.

1. It shall be unlawful for any person to drive a vehicle other than a passenger car on any of the following streets or parts of streets:

Provided: nothing in this Section shall prohibit any person from driving an emergency vehicle on any of those streets or parts of streets, or from driving on any of those streets or parts of streets a truck or other commercial vehicle making local deliveries to or pickups from premises located along that street or part of a street.

2. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 and costs.

PART 4

GENERAL PARKING REGULATIONS

§401. VEHICLES TO BE PARKED WITHIN MARKED SPACES; VEHICLES TO BE PARKED IN THE PERMITTED DIRECTION OF FLOW OF TRAFFIC; UNLAWFUL TO PARK VEHICLES IN CERTAIN MARKED AND UNMARKED AREAS.

1. Wherever a space is marked off on any street, avenue, drive, lane, road or way for the parking of an individual vehicle, every vehicle parked there shall be parked wholly within the lines bounding that space, and it shall be a violation of this Part for any person to park a vehicle or allow it to remain parked otherwise.
2. All vehicles parked on any street, avenue, drive, lane, road or way, whether parking spaces are marked or not, shall be parked only in the direction of the permitted traffic flow for that side of the street, avenue, drive, lane, road or way, and it shall be a violation of this Part for any person to park a vehicle or allow it to remain parked otherwise. This shall not apply to the southern side of Penn Street between West Street and Limestone Avenue where perpendicular parking is permitted.
3. It shall be unlawful to park any vehicle at any time: which in any way will block the intersection of any street, avenue, drive, lane, road or way or the entrance or exit of any street, avenue, drive, lane, road or way; within the painted line area adjacent to any fire hydrant or within fifteen (15') feet of any fire hydrant if no painted line area exists, whichever is greater; within the painted line area marking the permissible distance to park from any intersection; in any area where erected signs or painted lines indicate a "No Parking" area; which in any way will block any public sidewalk, private or public driveway or access way to a parking lot, parking facility or other facility of the Borough and it shall be a violation of this Part for any person to park a vehicle or allow it to remain parked in any manner herein described.

§403 PARKING OF TRUCKS, BUSES AND CERTAIN OTHER VEHICLES PROHIBITED IN CERTAIN LOCATIONS.

1. It shall be unlawful for any person to park, or allow to remain parked, on any of the streets or parts of streets within the Borough of Bedford any prohibited vehicle as defined in subsection (2) hereof.
2. As used in this Section, a "prohibited vehicle" shall mean any truck, truck tractor, trailer, semi trailer, bus, full trailer, motor home, recreational trailer, house trailer, implement of husbandry or combination as those terms are further defined in the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code. As used in this Section, a prohibited vehicle shall not include a pick-up truck or any emergency vehicle.
3. This Section shall not prohibit the momentary parking of a prohibited vehicle for the purpose of and while actually engaged in loading or unloading property; provided that such parking is done in a manner and location where nonprohibited vehicles would otherwise be permitted to park.

PART 6**REMOVAL AND IMPOUNDMENT OF ILLEGALLY PARKED VEHICLES****§601. APPLICABILITY AND SCOPE.**

This Part is enacted under authority of §6109(a-22) of the Vehicle Code and gives authority to the Borough to remove and impound those vehicles which are parked in violation of parking regulations of this Chapter. Vehicles which have been abandoned (as defined by the Vehicle Code) or which are parked in such a manner as to interfere with traffic or pose a hazard to others, may be towed under the provisions of the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code.

§602. AUTHORITY TO REMOVE AND IMPOUND.

The Borough shall have authority to remove and impound, or to order the removal and impounding, of any vehicle parked overtime or otherwise illegally, provided that the circumstances of its parking were within the conditions stated in §601 of this Part. Provided: no such vehicle shall be removed or impounded except in strict adherence to the provisions of this Part, or the provisions of the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code.

§603. DESIGNATION OF APPROVED STORAGE GARAGES; BONDING; TOWING AND STORAGE.

Removal and impounding of vehicles under this Part shall be done only by "approved storage garages" that shall be designated from time to time by the Borough Council. Every such garage shall submit evidence to the Borough Council that it is bonded or has acquired liability insurance in an amount satisfactory to the Borough Council as sufficient to indemnify owners of impounded vehicles against loss or damage to those vehicles while in the custody of the garage keeper for the purpose of towing or storage. The approved storage garage shall submit to the Borough Council its schedule of charges for towing and storage of vehicles under this Part, and, when the schedule is approved by Borough Council, those charges shall be adhered to by the approved storage garage; no different schedule of charges shall be demanded of or collected from any person whose vehicle is removed or impounded under this Part by any approved storage garage. The Borough Council shall delete from its list of approved storage garages any garage that makes any unapproved charge in connection with any vehicle removed or impounded under this Part.

§604. PAYMENT OF TOWING AND STORAGE CHARGES.

The payment of towing and storage charges shall not relieve the owner or driver of any vehicle from liability for any fine or penalty for the violation of the provision of this Part for which the vehicle was removed or impounded.

§605. RECLAMATION COSTS.

In order to reclaim his vehicle, the owner shall pay towing and storage costs, plus a \$25 fee of which \$10 shall be transferred to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation by the garage to which the vehicle was taken.

§606. RECORDS OF VEHICLES REMOVED AND IMPOUNDED.

§607. RESTRICTIONS UPON REMOVAL OF VEHICLES.

No vehicle shall be removed under the authority of this Part or the Vehicle Code if, at the time of the intended removal, the owner or the person for the time being in charge of the vehicle is present and expresses a willingness and intention to remove the vehicle immediately.

§608. PENALTY FOR VIOLATION.

Any person who shall violate any provision of this Part shall, upon conviction thereof, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$50 together with all costs of disposing of the vehicle under provisions of the Vehicle Code, 75 P.S. §7301 et seq., (1977) as hereafter amended, supplemented, modified or reenacted by the General Assembly of Pennsylvania.

§609. REPORTS AND DISPOSITION OF UNCLAIMED VEHICLES.

If after a period of 15 days the vehicle in storage remains unclaimed, a report shall be filed with PennDOT in accordance with §7311 of the Vehicle Code, by the person having legal custody of the vehicle. If the vehicle has not been claimed after 30 days, the vehicle may be transferred to a licensed Salvor who will then be responsible for filing the proper reports and disposing of the vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 73 of the Pennsylvania Motor Vehicle Code (75 Pa C.S.A. §101 et seq., as amended).

PART 7

WINTER WEATHER EMERGENCY

§701. DEFINITIONS.

The following words, when used in this Part, shall have the following meanings unless the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

SNOW - any precipitation depositing any accumulation on the street, including snow, sleet, hail, ice, and freezing rain.

STREET - any street, highway, avenue, drive, lane, road, or way in the borough of Bedford used by a vehicle.

VEHICLE - any self propelled motorized vehicle licensed to travel upon streets in the Borough of Bedford.

WINTER WEATHER EMERGENCY - state of street conditions that are hazardous and dangerous to vehicular and pedestrian traffic, as so declared by the Borough Manager or such person designated by the Borough Manager.

§702. DECLARATION OF WINTER WEATHER EMERGENCY.

A Winter Weather Emergency is hereby declared to exist in the Borough of Bedford whenever snow falls so that, in the opinion of the Borough Manager or such person designated by the Borough Manager the street conditions are hazardous and dangerous to vehicular and pedestrian traffic because of snow accumulation. The Borough Manager or such person designated by the Borough Manager shall have the authority to declare a Winter Weather Emergency, notice of which shall immediately be issued to the local radio and news services. In either instance, a Winter Weather Emergency is presumed to exist from 11:00 p.m. on the day of the accumulation of the snow and/or ice until 7:00 a.m. of the following day or for such period of time as designated by the Borough Manager or such person designated by the Borough Manager.

§703. UNATTENDED VEHICLES PROHIBITED DURING EMERGENCY.

During such time as a Winter Weather Emergency is in effect, it shall be a violation of this Part for any person, firm, organization or entity to park, allow to remain parked, abandon or leave unattended any vehicle on any street, its adjacent right-of-way, or in any municipal parking lot within the boundaries of the Borough of Bedford. This prohibition shall not apply to any parking areas which have been specifically depicted by the Borough Manager or such person designated by the Borough Manager as Winter Weather Emergency parking areas, provided all terms of the special depiction are complied with.

MOTOR VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC

§704. TICKETING OF VEHICLES PARKED UNLAWFULLY; EFFECT OF PAYMENT WITHIN 48 HOURS.

1. It shall be the duty of the police officers and traffic attendants of the Borough of Bedford, acting in accordance with the directions of the Chief of Police, to report:
 - A. The number of each parking space, when available, of the vehicle occupying the parking space that is, or has been, parked in violation of any provision of this Part.
 - B. The date and hour of such violation.
 - C. The license number of the vehicle.
 - D. Any other facts, the knowledge of which is necessary for a thorough understanding of the circumstances attending the violation.
2. The police officers or traffic attendants making the report shall also place on or attach to the vehicle a notice to the owner or driver of the vehicle that the vehicle was parked in violation of §703 of this Part and instructing the owner or driver that if he will pay the sum of \$20 to the Borough, for the use of the Borough, by enclosing \$20 in the envelope provided and either hand delivering the said envelope to the Borough Office or mailing the said envelope to the Borough Office, within forty-eight (48) hours after the time of the notice, that the act will save the violator from prosecution and from payment of the fine prescribed in §705 of this Part. The continuation of such violation of §703 of this Part for each successive twenty-four (24) hour time period shall constitute a separate offense.

§705. PENALTIES.

Any person who violates §703 of this Part and who fails to pay the fine set forth in §704 of this Part within forty-eight (48) hours of the violation shall be cited and, upon conviction, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 plus costs of prosecution.

PART 8

REGULATION OF PEDALCYCLES AND NONMOTORIZED VEHICLES

§801. RIDING OF PEDALCYCLES ON SIDEWALKS ALONG CERTAIN STREETS PROHIBITED.

It shall be unlawful for any person to ride a pedalcycle on the sidewalks along the following portions of the streets in the Borough:

<u>Street</u>	<u>Side</u>	<u>Between</u>
Juliana Street	Both	Fort park entrance and John Street
Penn Street	Both	Juliana Street and Richard Street
Pitt Street	Both	Bedford Street and Thomas Street
Richard Street	Both	Raystown Bridge and Vondersmith Avenue

Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$5 and costs.

§802. RESTRICTIONS ON USE OF PUSHCARTS.

1. The word "pushcart," as used in this Section, shall mean a vehicle, including a pedalcycle, propelled solely by human power and used, or intended for use, for the display, exhibit or sale of goods, wares or merchandise.
2. It shall be unlawful for any person to propel a pushcart upon any sidewalk in any business district except as necessary to move the pushcart to a location from which it is to be loaded or unloaded or from which goods, wares or merchandise are to be sold or dispensed under permit from the Borough Council as provided in subsection (3) of this Section.
3. It shall be unlawful for any person to park a pushcart upon any sidewalk for the purpose of selling or dispensing goods, wares or merchandise from that pushcart to passersby, except under permit from the Borough Council. Every such permit shall be issued to the person making application for the permit, upon payment of a fee, which shall be for the use of the Borough, set by the Borough Council pursuant to a Resolution. The permit shall be granted to the applicant, upon payment of the fee, and upon his signing an agreement with the Borough Council that he shall be bound by the conditions imposed by Borough Council and made a part of the permit, dealing with the following matters:
 - A. Restricting or limiting the parking of the pushcart to one or more stated locations upon the sidewalk and to stated days and hours at each location;
 - B. Stating requirements to be adhered to in connection with the disposal of garbage and refuse resulting from the operations carried on;

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- C. Requiring that there be no violation of any law, ordinance or regulation pertaining to health, sanitation and the handling of food or drink.
- 4. Any person who violates any provision of this Section, or any condition of any permit granted under this section, shall be guilty of a summary offense, and, upon conviction, shall be sentenced to pay a fine of \$25 and costs.

§803. SKATES, SKATEBOARDS, COASTERS, SLEDS AND OTHER TOY VEHICLES.

- 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to ride on a sled upon any sidewalk or upon any roadway in the Borough. Provided; nothing in this subsection shall prevent a pedestrian from pulling a sled, with or without a rider, upon a sidewalk or, in case no sidewalk exists, upon a roadway.
- 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in roller-skating, skateboarding or to ride upon or propel any coaster or other toy vehicle upon any sidewalk or street in the business district, except that nothing in this subsection shall prevent a pedestrian from pulling a coaster or other toy vehicle, with or without a rider, upon any sidewalk or street.
- 3. Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall, upon conviction, be sentenced to pay a fine of \$5 and costs.
